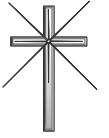




Thorner's Church of England VA Primary School Assembly Themes, Summer 1st half 2024



Peace

Throughout this half term we are reflecting on the value of Peace. We will remind children what a value is and ask them to share examples of peace that they have seen. *(If the weather is suitable we will take the opportunity to do some of these assemblies in the Discovery Area.)*

Some questions we will consider:

- What strategies do we have in place to encourage children to appreciate quietness and opportunities for calm reflection?
- How do we encourage pupils to solve their differences in a constructive way, and to develop the skills of a peacemaker?
- How do we introduce children to the Christian concepts of 'peace with God' and the 'peace of God'?
- What opportunities do we take to introduce children to issues of peace and justice both locally and internationally?
