

























We're creating two suggested sequences to support single and mixed-age classes and settings. However, you can interchange projects between sequences to best fit your school's context and children's interests.

	<p><b>Exploring Autumn</b></p> <p>This mini project teaches children about the natural changes that happen during autumn, including how the weather changes, why trees lose their leaves and how wild animals prepare for the cold weather coming in winter.</p>		<p><b>Build It Up</b></p> <p>This mini project teaches children about different structures and buildings that they can find in the world around them and gives them opportunities to work in groups to create exciting structures.</p>	
	<p><b>Once Upon a Time</b></p> <p>This language-rich project supports children to develop a love of stories and reading. It encourages children to learn, retell and act out familiar and traditional tales, including <i>Goldilocks</i>, <i>The Three Little Pigs</i> and <i>Cinderella</i>.</p>		<p><b>Marvellous Machines</b></p> <p>This interest-led project teaches children about the important technology that is part of their daily lives and how machines help us. The project gives them the opportunity to build and create marvellous machines.</p>	 Coming soon
	<p><b>Sparkle and Shine</b></p> <p>This mini project teaches children about the celebrations and traditions that take place during the winter holiday season, both in the UK and around the world.</p>		<p><b>Puppets and Pop Ups</b></p> <p>This mini creative project explores puppets and pop up books and gives children the opportunity to make their own and use them to tell exciting stories.</p>	 Coming soon
Spring	<p><b>Starry Night</b></p> <p>This project teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals and people who work at night.</p>		<p><b>Long Ago</b></p> <p>This project explores how the children have changed and grown since they were babies and compares life in the past to their lives today.</p>	 Coming soon
	<p><b>Winter Wonderland</b></p> <p>This mini project teaches children about the changes that happen during winter, including the different types of weather associated with the winter season. It also explores environments that have snow all year round.</p>		<p><b>Stories and Rhymes</b></p> <p>This language-rich mini project teaches children a variety of traditional stories and rhymes, and gives them the opportunity to play with words and learn new vocabulary.</p>	 Coming soon
	<p><b>Dangerous Dinosaurs</b></p> <p>This exciting interest-led project teaches children about the different creatures that roamed Earth millions of years ago and how they are related to animals that live on Earth today.</p>		<p><b>Ready Steady Grow</b></p> <p>This project teaches children about food and farming and explores themes, including where food comes from, what plants and animals need to grow and survive and the importance of a healthy, balanced diet.</p>	 Coming soon
