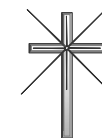




Thorner's Church of England VA Primary School

My child is very happy at the school but has some negative reactions to the Zoom sessions which can leave them introverted afterwards sometimes. This is peculiar to our current circumstances and can happen after any video call. The calls are much easier to follow when the entire class is muted while the teacher is talking.

21	<p>We are always looking for ideas to make the school even better. Can you suggest improvements you would like to see?</p> <p>I have no improvements to suggest! I would say what an amazing team you have at Thorner's. Each member of staff we have had dealings with since our initial enquiries were made to move our Daughter to Thorner's have the most positive and reassuring portrayal of the school (Marion, Mike, Minty-in order of meeting!) You truly deserve to get "Outstanding" rating at your next Ofsted Assessment!</p> <p>I think we ought to have an annual 'staff day off' when the parents have to plan and deliver a timetable for a day (including support). I suspect it will make the children and parents very grateful that it doesn't happen more often.</p> <p>I would love my child to spend as much time outside as possible as I know this will be harder in Year 1 upwards.</p> <p>More opportunities for older children to make use of outdoor spaces, perhaps a lunchtime club for maintaining outdoor areas such as the discovery area?</p> <p>My only issue with the on-line learning is accessing all the lessons via emails. I've spent quite a while looking back through passed emails trying to find the link for that particular lesson. It would be useful if the kids had a portal (e.g. Class Dojo or Tapestry) or a page on the website that they could access independently and have everything in one space. I appreciate that you have told us how to create a link in our diaries, but I haven't quite got my head around that yet and it won't work if children are not always using the same device.</p> <p>Would perhaps like to see abit more commitment to sport competitions and clubs such as the running events when they had no real chance to practice and sport clubs eg football, netball, cricket that actually run on a regular basis. Overall we love the school and our kids have had/have a great time!</p> <p>Once covid restrictions lift please could the children have more space to run around at break/playtimes eg using the field behind LATCH.</p>

Other comments:

We moved our child to Thorners in Sept 20 from another local primary, joining year 4. The difference between the 2 schools cannot be exaggerated. Mr White is a great teacher. He quickly assessed my child's strengths/weaknesses and provides appropriate level work and great lessons. He also listened to parental feedback at parents evening regarding harder extension tasks in Maths and these were actioned- thank you.

Mr Sitch cannot be praised highly enough. The quality of the management communication and running of the school (from a parent perspective) is unsurpassed. He seems to know what is going on, about everything at all times. Parental concerns/questions etc are actioned immediately. He is also very pro-active eg our child's SALT need was picked up by school before I mentioned it. There is a definite 'can do' attitude which is in direct contrast to what we experienced previously.

Mr Sitch appears to have created a happy learning environment for the children and as parents we have no concerns at all about quality of tuition, the school etc. Well done – we are blown away!

It is worth highlighting that even in the unprecedented times the school excels. The quality of the home school provisions is in a different league to that we experienced previously. We cannot thank you enough.

The only thing I would like to add is that the school functions as part of a wider community. We as parents feel welcomed by the school and an integral part of it too, which in turn feeds back into our positive regard for the school and staff. The children pick up on our positivity regarding Thorner's and that makes them feel safe, secure and happy to be part of that community. From past experiences, I know that not all primary schools are as welcoming to parents and indeed often actively discourage any interaction apart from the 'official' channels of parent/teacher associations. It is this friendly, personal and welcoming aspect from all the school staff of Thorner's that makes it particularly special.
